TRANSFER RULE

Any student transferring from one high school to another shall lose eligibility for participation in any Association sponsored athletic activities (varsity, J.V., sophomore and freshman) for 12 months from the day of attendance at the new school when transferring for the reasons designated in the By-Laws.

UNDUE INFLUENCE

The use of undue influence by any person, connected or not connected, with a member school, to secure the transfer of a student to a member school for the purpose of participation in Association athletic activities shall result in a loss of eligibility for the student for 12 months.

AMATEUR RULE

You must be an amateur to be eligible to represent your high school

AWARDS

As a participant in any UHSAA approved activity you cannot accept cash or merchandise awards.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION REQUIRED

You must have a physicians certificate stating you are physically able to compete in inter-school athletic contests.

DEFACEMENT OF SCHOOL PROPERTY

Defacement of marring of school property by members of another school may subject the offending school to suspension from the Association for 12 months.

AGE LIMIT RULE

You shall not be eligible to represent your school in any contest if you reach the age of 19 years prior to September first.

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Attention Students, Parents and Guardians!

There are risks and dangers inherent with participation in high school athletics and activities. Participants might be seriously injured in any activity. Your signatures on the reverse side of this card give permission for the named student to participate in interscholastic activities and indicate that you are aware there are risks involved with participation in said activities. It is strongly recommended that every student carry adequate insurance to cover any accident or injury that might occur from participation in high school activities.

Attention Students!

The years in which you represent your high school in interscholastic competition may be the most enjoyable years in your life. As you compete, your school will have local rules and regulations you must follow and the Utah High School Activities Association (UHSAA) has rules and regulations incorporated into the Association’s constitution and by-laws to which students, school personnel and fans must adhere.

The information on this card is only a summary of the UHSAA By-Laws. A complete listing of the eligibility rules is found in the UHSAA handbook. Any questions concerning your eligibility must be answered by your principal.

You will lose your eligibility to represent your school in interscholastic competition if you violate UHASS by-laws. It is extremely important that you review the material contained on this card with your parents, coaches and principal to thoroughly understand the UHAS by-laws and how they relate to you.

UNDERGRADUATE STANDING

No student shall compete in any high school activity who is a graduate of a regular four-year high school or a secondary school with the same graduation requirements as a four-year high school.

SCHOLASTIC RULES

You must be a full time student at the school where participating in the activity. You cannot have more than one failing grade in the preceding grading period. You must have obtained a minimum of 2.0 GPA in the preceding grading period.

LIMITED TEAM MEMBERSHIP

A student while participating as a member of a high school team may not participate on a team not sponsored by his or her school in the same activity during the same season.

SPORTS SEASON RULE

You may only participate in Association activities for up to 4 seasons in any one activity, and not more than three seasons in any one activity after entering 10th grade.

ATTENDANCE RULE

After you enter 10th grade, or an equivalent level of education, you shall have 3 consecutive years of eligibility for association activities.

CHARTER/HOME/PRIVATE SCHOOLS

If you are enrolled in a charter, home or private school, you can participate in extracurricular public school activities at the school within whose boundaries your legal guardian resides, or at the public school form which you withdrew to attend home, charter or private school and only for sports or activities which are not available at your charter or private school.

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
