REGISTRATION CHECKLIST

____ I have read the registration information and understand the attendance policy for HHS Summer Dr. Ed.

____ I understand that my son or daughter cannot legally drive on the road with anyone until he/she is issued a valid learner permit. You are strongly encouraged to get your permit before the class begins.

____ I have read the "*How Do I Get a Learner Permit?*" checklist.

____ I have completed the SUMMER SCHOOL DRIVERS EDUCATION 2012 application (available on the HHS website). I understand incomplete applications will not be accepted and will not reserve a spot in the class.

____ I have a photocopy of the student's birth certificate (must be 16 on or before 10/15/12— no exceptions— please don't ask for one).

____ I have paid the \$140 fee to the HHS Main Office and received a receipt.

____ I have submitted the application, fee receipt, and photocopy of student's birth certificate to an HHS main office secretary. **(40 student maximum for the class---first-come, first served)**

Registration information

The following is not a comprehensive description of our Driver Education program, but it will help you to get a basic idea of how our system works.

Fee: \$95 during the regular school year, \$140 during summer school.

Attendance: Utah state law requires that students receive a minimum of 27 hours, classroom time for drivers education. Any type of absence or tardy counts against a student's 27 hours of instruction whether it is excused or not. **IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO PASS THIS CLASS IF THE STATE MANDATED 27-HOUR MINIMUM OF CLASS TIME IS NOT MET.**

Course Objectives: It is our position that Driver Education is merely a *"beginning"* for students. While we cannot provide them with every driving experience and all-encompassing driving wisdom, we do believe that focusing on basic fundamentals of attitude and skill can help a driver education student *begin* to develop safe and sound driving habits that become lifetime skills. The course objectives below are based upon a practical philosophy of defensive driving. We strive to help students to:

1. Understand the importance of a mature, responsible driving attitude.
2. Become 100% safety belt users.
3. Understand the dangers and costs of impaired driving.
4. Begin learning basic driving skills.
5. Learn and obey the rules of the road.
6. Prepare to pass the state written driver license exam and the state road test.

Learner Permits: Students must have a valid learner permit in order to do any driving in H.H.S. Dr. Ed. The best time to get a permit is approximately 15 years and 3-6 months of age. Getting a permit at age 15 makes it virtually impossible to get your license before it expires on the 16th birthday. We encourage students to get their permits before they take the class; however, it is not required. Please go to driverlicense.utah.gov for more specific information on how to get a valid Utah learner permit.

Summer School 2012: *The summer session will run from June 4th thru 15th. Classes will run from 8am to 12pm.* During that time there will be 27 hours of classroom instruction given. Range instruction will also take place around this two week period, either before or after classroom instruction each day. Students must turn 16 prior to October 15, 2012—no exceptions. If you would like to take summer school but the June class will not work for you, please contact neighboring high schools to see if their class schedule can accommodate you—every high school in the Jordan School District runs a summer Driver's Education class and the times and dates vary based upon when individual department chairs decide to schedule classes. You are welcome to take their course if they have room for you.

Herriman High Drivers Education Summer School Schedule

Class Schedule:

Week 1 --Monday June 4 thru Thursday June 7 --8am to 12pm

Week 2 --Tuesday June 11 thru Friday June 15 --8am to 12pm

Please note: Students must be in class for 27 hours. Classroom attendance is mandatory.

Range Schedule:

AM range starts Tuesday morning June 5th and runs every day before class from 6am to 8am.

PM range starts Monday June 4th and runs every day after class from 12pm to 2pm.

Each student will be assigned to 3 ranges.

Each range runs 2hrs.

Students are required to complete 6 hours of range time.

Road Schedule:

Students will be scheduled for road drives after they have obtained a learners permit.

It is our goal to help your son or daughter enjoy a good start in driving by helping him or her to develop a mature, responsible driving attitude and set of basic defensive driving skills. How Do I Get a Learner Permit?

___ Turn **15** years of age—it is best to wait until 15 years and 2-3 months of age as it is very difficult for some to finish all requirements before the 16th birthday—many students won't even finish the classroom portion before that date.

___ **Pass the state written test** at the D.L.D. This is the recommended option. You may take the test twice in the same day and once on another day for the \$15 learner permit fee—if you need to take the test a fourth time or more you will need to pay an additional \$15. The sooner you get your permit, the sooner you will be eligible to apply for a license—you must hold a learner permit for 6 months before applying for a license unless you have already turned 18 years of age when your learner permit is issued.

OR

Pass the state written test at HHS during the summer class and receive a certificate from your teacher that verifies that you passed the written test.

If you have passed the state written test, Be prepared to do the following...

- Go to the D.L.D. (please, please, please, DO NOT go to the D.M.V.!!!!!!) with a **parent or guardian** to apply for a learner permit (you may already be there!). Take the following items with you:
- Picture I.D.
- Contacts or glasses (if you wear corrective lenses)
- Social security card or ITN card (individual tax number)
- Original or certified copy of birth certificate (no photocopies or miniature birth certificate wallet-size cards will be accepted)
- \$15 learner permit fee
- Certificate verifying you received a passing test score (If you passed the test at HHS)
- Parents need to bring 2 (two) of the following items that will prove Utah residency: recent bank statement, credit card bill or utility bill; or vehicle registration. No cell phone bills will be accepted as proof of residency.
